CHLAMYDIA

WHAT IS CHLAMYDIA?

Chlamydia is a bug that is passed from one person to another during sex



HOW DO YOU CATCH CHLAMYDIA?

It is passed from one person to another through:-

Having Sex



Sharing Sex Toys





It may be possible to pass the bug from your fingers to your eyes if you have touching genital parts



WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF I DON'T GET TREATMENT?

The bug can spread to other parts of the body. This can cause damage to your body



It may stop you being able to have Babies

The bug (chlamydia) will not go away without treatment





WHAT CAN HAPPEN IF I AM PREGNANT?

The bug can be passed on to your baby. This can cause the baby to have sore eyes (conjunctivitis).





You can get tablets (antibiotics) to take whilst you are pregnant that will not harm the baby. You must tell the doctor if you think you are pregnant

TREATMENT

You will be given Antibiotics (pills).





If you think you are **PREGNANT**,









tell the doctor

Do not have sex for 7 days or until you have finished the treatment



SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS





things that you may see on your body

Women

Yellow, green or watery liquid (discharge) from your vagina.





Pain when passing urine (peeing)

Pain in your stomach





Bleeding between periods
More bleeding during periods

Bleeding after sex

Men

White/cloudy or watery fluid from your penis





Pain when passing urine (peeing)

Pain in your testicles (balls)



Both (men and women)

The eyes may get infected. Causing pain, swelling, irritation and discharge.



Have I got Chlamydia?



If think you may have the bug you can only find out by having a test.

What are the tests?

The doctor or nurse will wipe a swab (cotton bud) over the area where the bug is e.g. penis, or vagina.



This is quick and does not hurt.



The doctor may also want some urine (pee) from you. Try not to have a pee for 2 hours before doing this test.
